



# MANAGING CHALLENGING CONVERSATIONS TO PROMOTE COMMUNITY COHESION

## WHAT ARE THE AIMS OF THE TRAINING?

This is a free training session available to members of staff within Educational Settings in Wolverhampton and staff within Children's Services.

Wolverhampton is a city valued for its diversity. This training seeks to promote community cohesion through supporting practitioners to engage in conversations where children and young people may be expressing discriminatory views. We will consider psychological perspectives on how discriminatory views are formed and why these conversations can feel challenging. We will then consider how to challenge discriminatory views whilst maintaining a relational approach.

Any professionals working with children and young people.

Staff from educational settings including primary, secondary, post-16 and specialist settings. Staff within Children's Services including Youth Justice Services, Social Workers, Inclusion Team

The course will cover:

- Psychological perspectives on how discriminatory views may be formed
- Identifying what conversations might be difficult and why
- The goals of challenging discriminatory views
- Relational approaches to challenging discriminatory views
